Summary Discipline Policy Form

Discipline is more than outward pressure--it involves inner understanding and acceptance. The goal of discipline is to develop godly self-control.

Our aim is to teach all students to become responsible adults. This is achieved through learning respect for other people and their property. Any staff member has authority over any student, whether or not he or she has that student in class or not. A student may be corrected by any staff member and should do as instructed.

Discipline Philosophy

Good discipline means that the classroom is relatively free from confusion, disorder, and anti-social behavior. It means each child operates freely within a structured framework, which they understand, accept, and incorporate into their behavior without constant reminder or discipline. In fact, our goal is to teach each student through loving instruction to become an independent, mature follower of Jesus Christ, ready and equipped to lead and serve his or her generation.

SMS realizes that there is not a miracle cure for all problems nor is there a single, simple method for solving them. It is the School's intent to give each teacher some practical and effective methods for classroom management and to include the parent as the primary disciplinarian in the life of the child. The discipline system should have the effect of drawing close the lines of communication between parents, Faculty, and the Principal.

Student Conduct and Discipline

Students are expected to abide by general school rules and by those of the individual classroom teacher. SMS does not permit foul language, verbal threats of harm, disruptive behavior, any fighting or aggressive behavior between students, or disrespect to staff, other children, or property. Possible disciplinary steps that follow may involve conferences with the principal, parents, teacher, and the student to discuss possible solutions for the misbehavior and to inform the student of the serious effects of continued misconduct.

In addition to necessary reminders, counsel, and reproof that teachers give day-by-day, SMS will use a Discipline Policy. Every teacher in our school is responsible for every student in our school. This means that if any teacher observes a student misbehaving, he/she has the duty to discipline and hold the student responsible for his/her actions.

Discipline will be conducted in the following manner:

1. The teacher is responsible to assign detention when the student has disrupted the classroom and detention is warranted in accordance with this policy.
2. The student will be verbally warned to discontinue his/her actions.
3. If the student's actions, verbal; or physical, disrupt the classroom after the initial warning, the student will be assigned detention.
4. A note will be sent home with the student informing the parent of the student's actions and the consequence of said action.

5. The student will serve detention in the teacher's classroom or in Detention Class from 3:35 to 4:00pm.
6. If a student receives 3 detentions in any 1 class or multiple classes within 1 week, the student will be referred to the Principal.
7. The Principal will assume responsibility of the situation. Upon investigation of the matter, he/she will determine the best course of action.
8. After the teacher has given 3 initial detentions, the Principal will assign a 5-day detention, to be held each day from 3:35pm to 4:00pm, as the next course of action.
9. The Principal will counsel with the teacher, the student, and parent (when deemed necessary by the Principal) in an effort to provide instruction as to new or expected behaviors in order to avoid further detentions.
10. While the Discipline Policy provides guidelines that will be generally followed in most circumstances, the Principal reserves the right under any and all circumstances to determine, in his/her sole discretion, the level of discipline appropriate for the situation – ranging from verbal warning to detention to authorized swat(s) to immediate expulsion. For example, if the student continues to engage in inappropriate or disruptive behavior in the classroom; or engages in behavior of a serious nature while on campus (such as violent or extremely disrespectful or disruptive behavior); or engages in a crime, whether on or off campus; the Principal may immediately expel the student, in which case the student will no longer be allowed to attend SMS. The School Board reserves the right to intervene at any time and will have the final decision if such intervention is exercised. Upon expulsion or any other disciplinary action, tuition already paid will not be refunded.

Swat or In-School Suspension

Corporal punishment is limited to spanking or paddling the student and occurs only in accordance with the following guidelines:

- The student is told of the reason corporal punishment is being given.
- The Principal will give corporal punishment with the Vice Principal or a teacher as a witness.
- The instrument (e.g., paddle) and number of swats to be used shall be approved by the Principal.
- A record shall be maintained of each disciplinary referral and application of corporal punishment. If a parent/guardian objects to corporal punishment as a means of discipline, he/she must sign this form and indicate such.
- Parents and teachers of said student will be notified.
